Since its origins, the program has been expanded to include more than 40 product

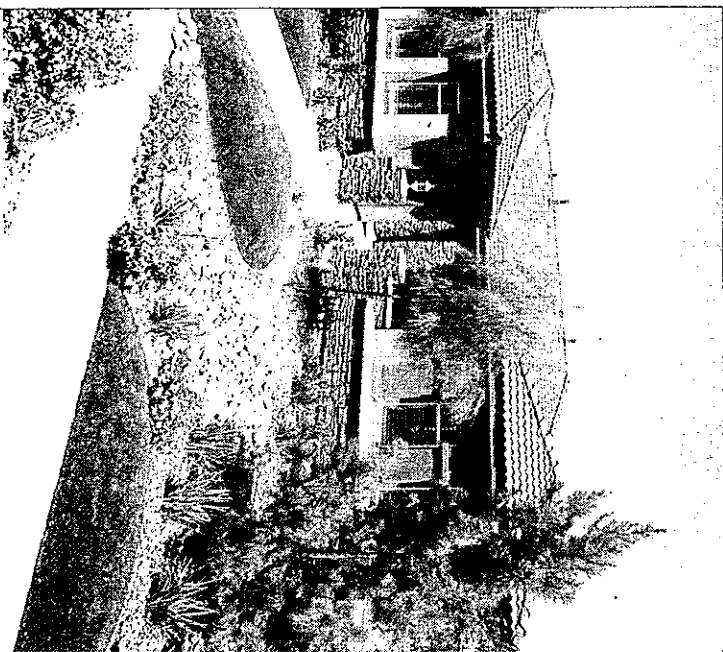
categories that conserve energy and protect the environment — from appliances, electronics, lighting, windows and office products — to homes and even mortgages.
